THOMAS CHRISTIANSEN

Thomas Christiansen, head coach of the Panamanian national team, has a clear objective for this 2026 World Cup.

The Dane constantly says that he wants an ambitious, hardworking group that will fight to put "Panama on the world map" of international football.

"We want to compete, we want to put Panama on the world map and for the country to be proud of its national team. We no longer just have to celebrate Panama's goals," expressed the national team coach.

Christiansen, 53, seeks to achieve an objective that several of his players have already expressed and set as their goal for this World Cup: to win a match and advance to the next round.

"What we have done in these five years is compete with great teams. We have beaten

the United States on several occasions, and that is what we want to do against Ghana, Croatia, and England, who we know are tough opponents."

Since his arrival in August 2020, he currently stands as the coach with the most games in charge in the history of Panamanian football.

A legacy that, as leader of the only Central American team in the 2026 World Cup, he will seek to solidify.

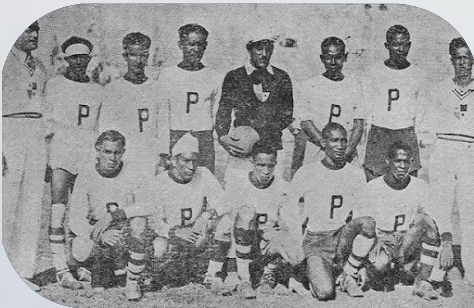

WE'RE BACK AT THE WORLD CUP STAGE UNDEFEATED QUALIFICATION



The Panamanian National Team qualified for its second FIFA World Cup, after finishing as leaders of Group A in the Final Round of the CONCACAF Qualifiers.

Following our debut in the 2018 edition in Russia, Panama will look to make a surprising run in this year's World Cup.

In CONCACAF Qualifiers, Panama advanced through the Second Round with a perfect record of four wins in four matches against Guyana,

Montserrat, Belize, and Nicaragua. Then, in the Final Round, they improved steadily, ultimately qualifying undefeated with a resounding 3-0 home victory over El Salvador in November, securing their place as Group A winner and the only Central American team in the 2026 World Cup.

RUSSIA 2018



October 10, 2017 is a date that will be forever remembered in Panamanian football history.

It was the moment when the Panamanian National Team experienced one of the most important chapters in its footballing history, qualifying for its first-ever FIFA World Cup.

That historic achievement came after an intense CONCACAF qualifying campaign, sealed with a memorable 2-1 victory over Costa Rica, thanks to an unforgettable goal by defender Román Torres that sent the entire country into celebration.

In its World Cup debut in Russia, Panama was part of Group G and faced international football powerhouses such as Belgium, England, and Tunisia.

During that tournament, defender and captain Felipe Baloy scored Panama's first-ever World Cup goal, a strike against England that remains one of the most emotional moments in Panamanian football.

Toronto Stadium will host Panama's first two matches in Group L of the World Cup. known as BMO Field, it is Canada's first soccer-specific stadium and is the home of the Canadian National Team.

It is also home for the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League (CFL) and Toronto FC of MLS.

Toronto has hosted major events such as the 1976 Olympic Football Tournament, the 1974 CONCACAF Youth Championship, the 1987 FIFA U-16 World Cup, the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup Canada™, and the 2014 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup Canada™.

For the FIFA World Cup 2026, there are six matches that will be played in Toronto.

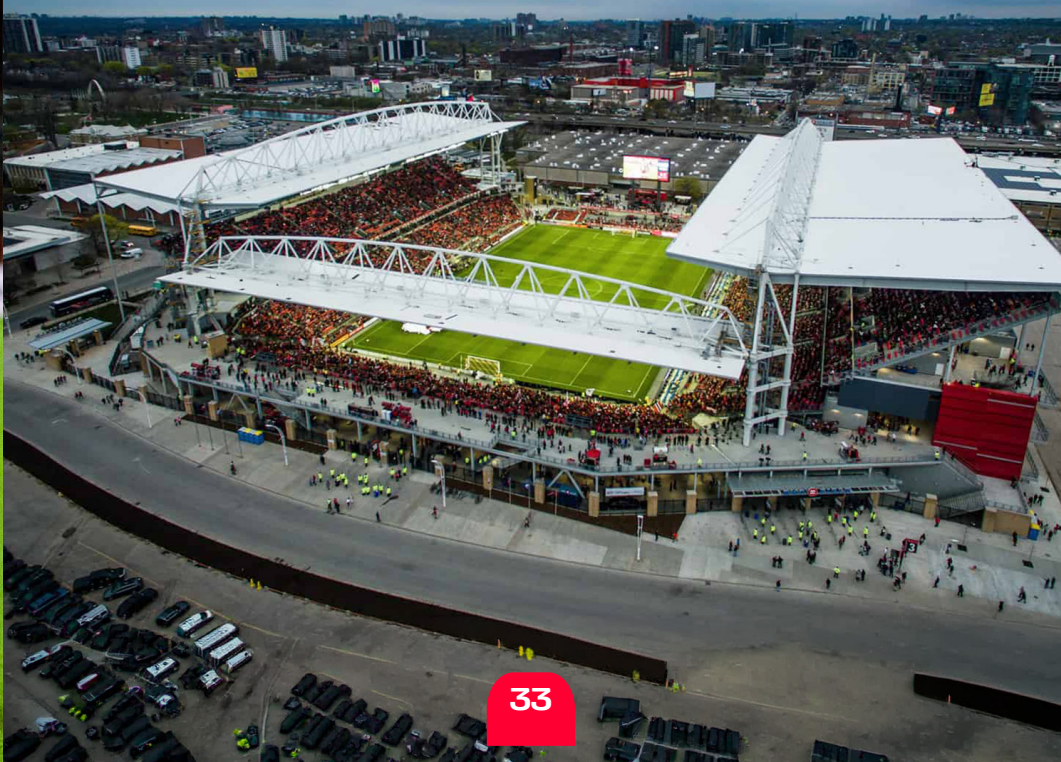

Home of the NFL's NY Giants and NY Jets, it's also remembered for hosting games of the FIFA World Cup USA 1994, the Women's World Cup 1999, the 2009 Gold Cup Final, and the final match of the 2016 Copa America Centenario, which drew a record crowd of 82,026 spectators.


